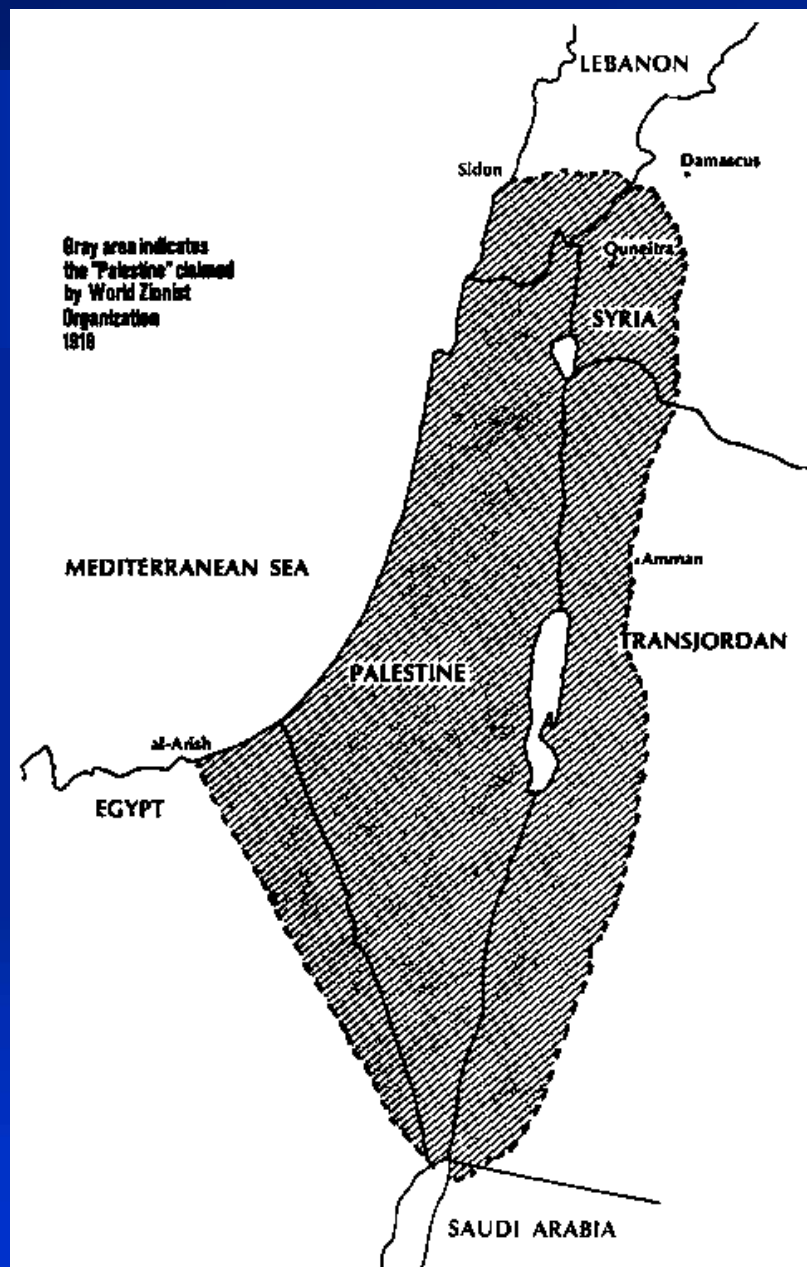

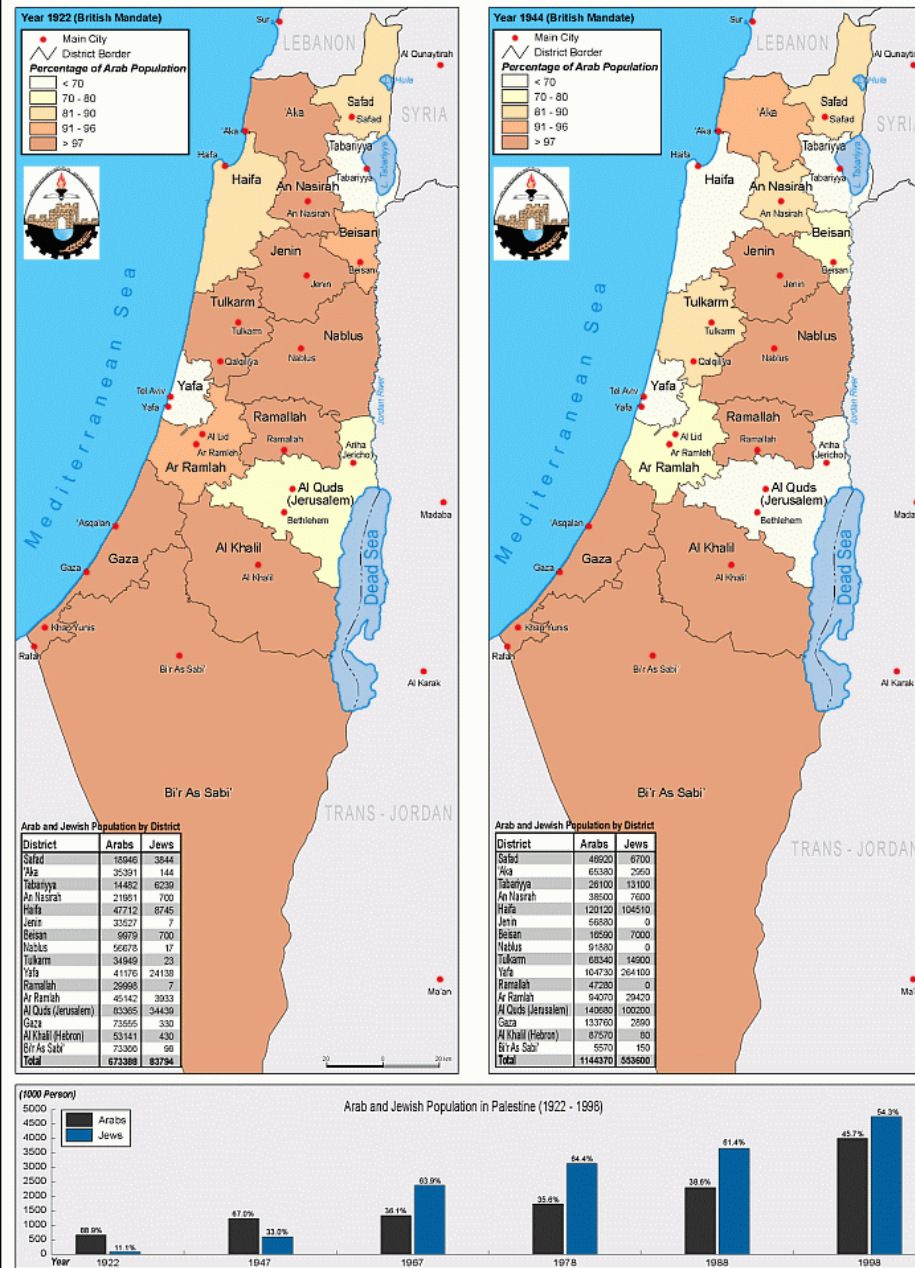

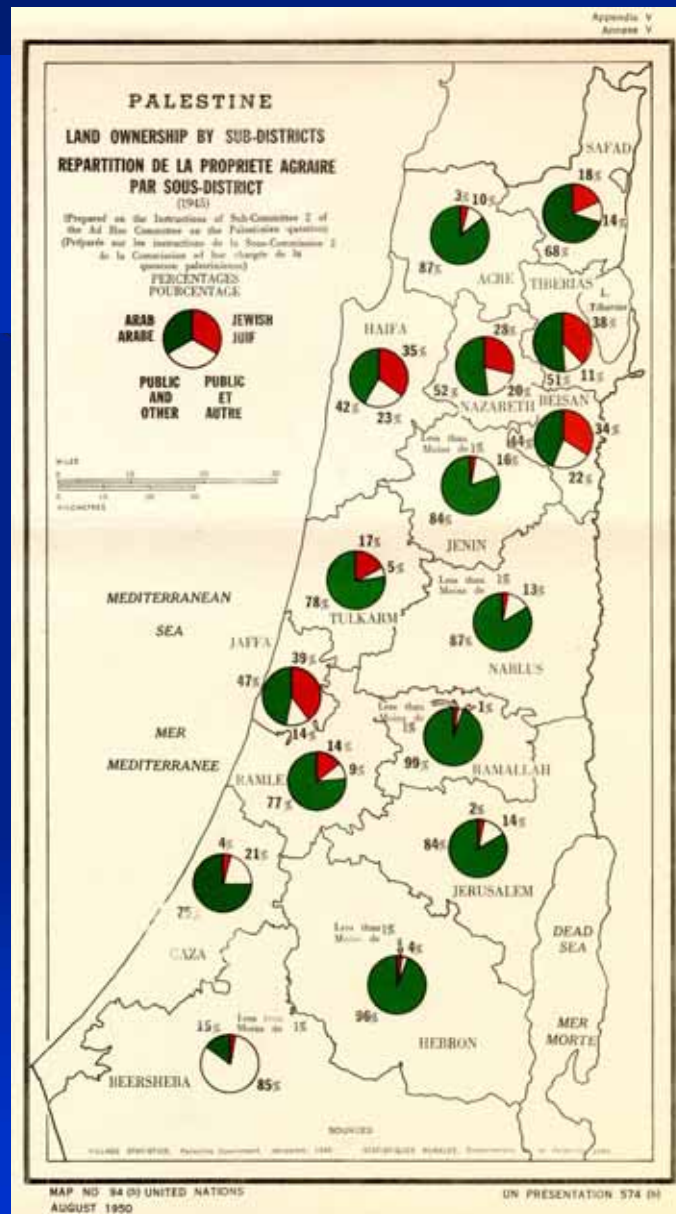


Percentage of Arab and Jewish Population by Sub-District in 1922 and 1944

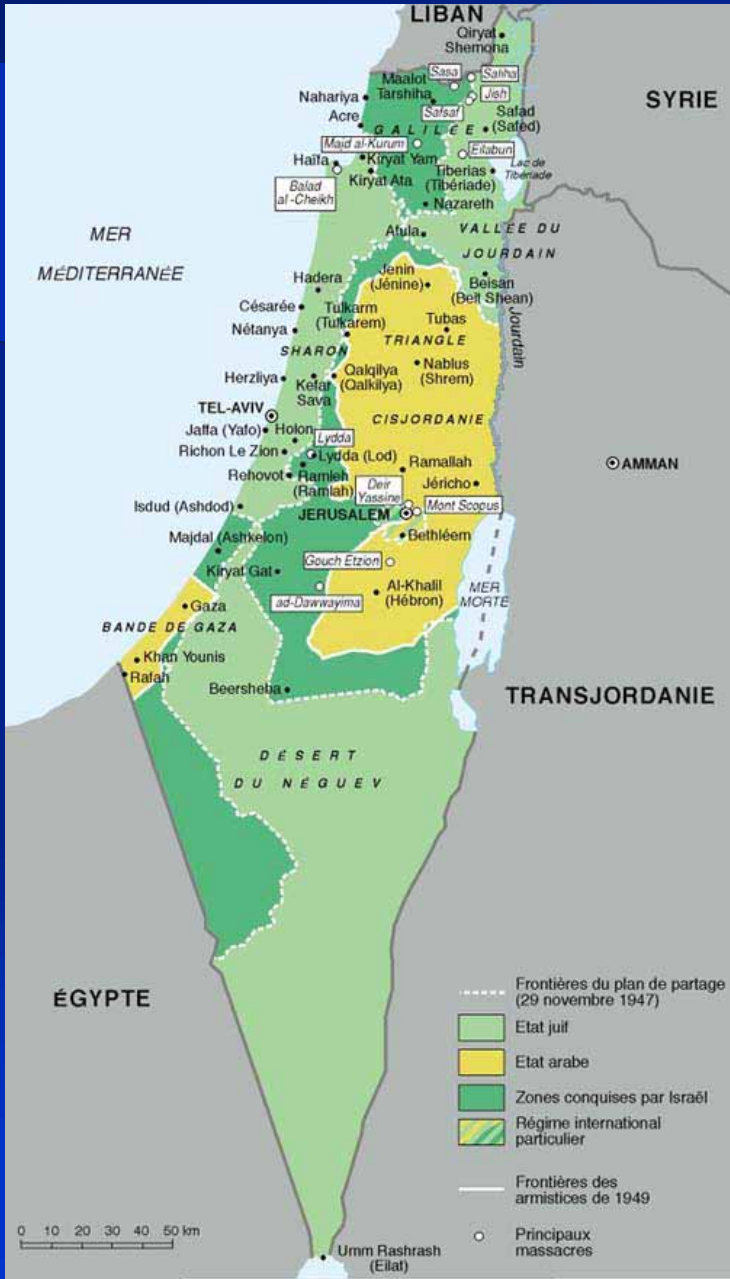

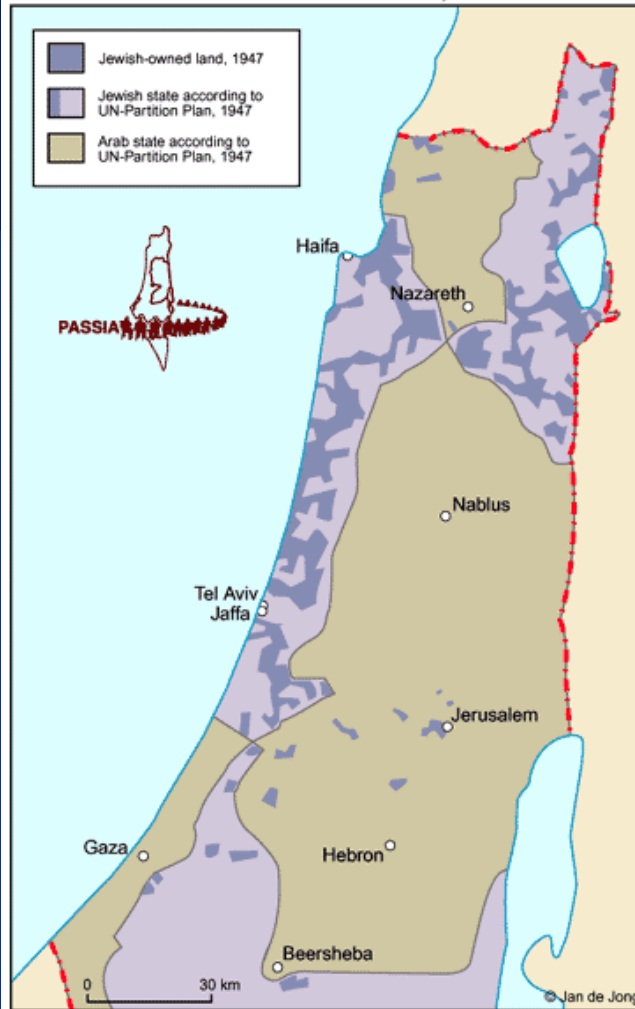


Partició de Palestina 1947-48

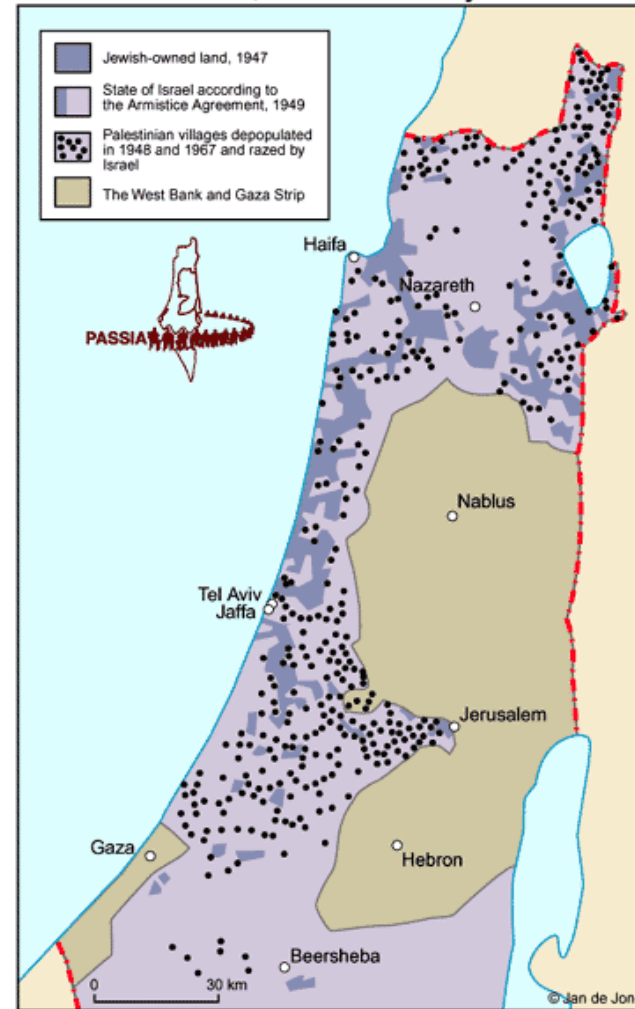


Propietat terra i expulsió 1948

Palestinian Villages Depopulated in 1948 and 1967, and Razed by Israel

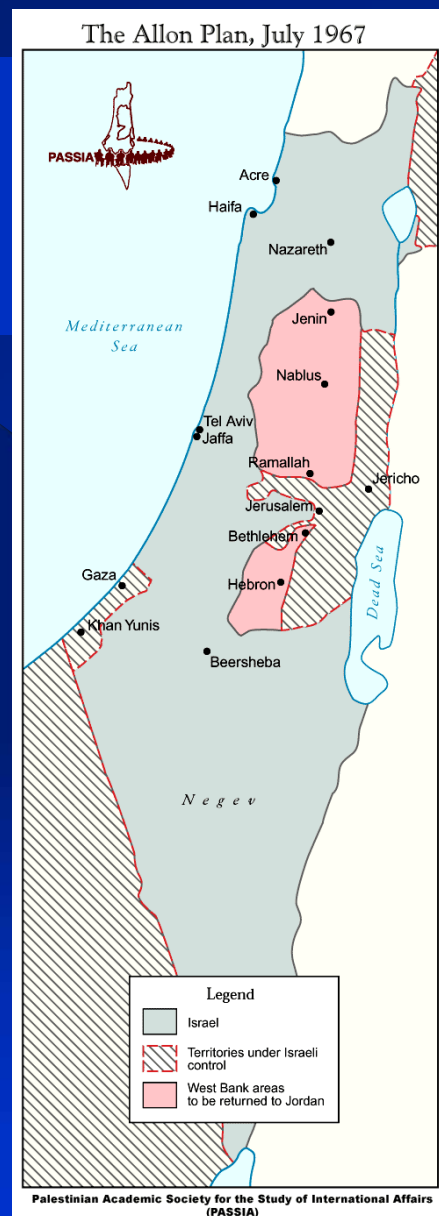

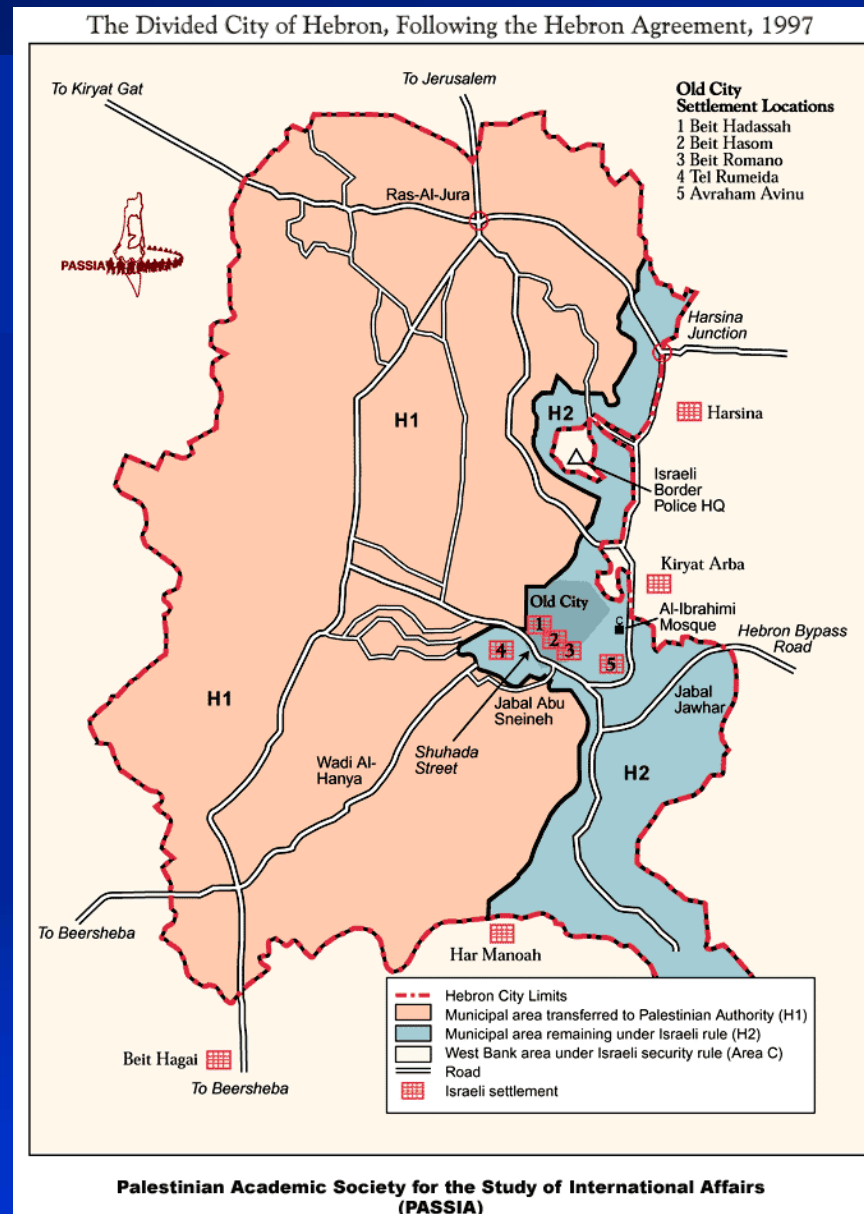

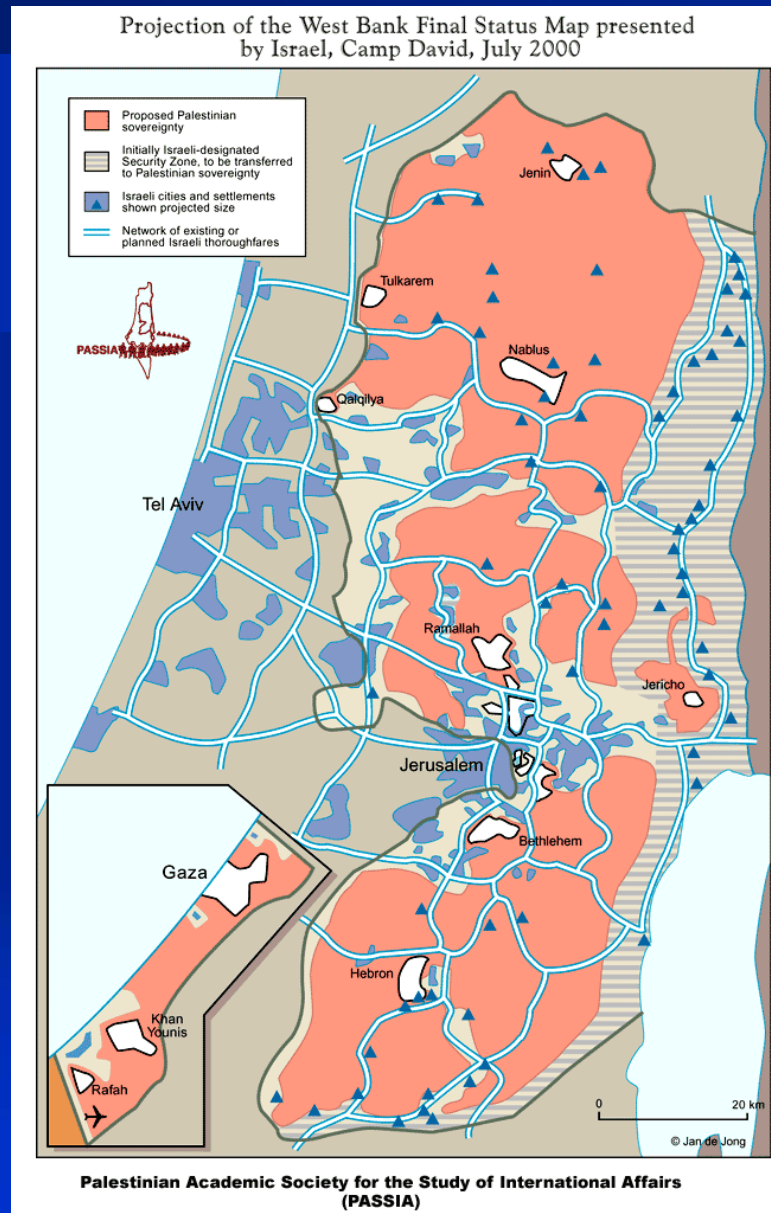

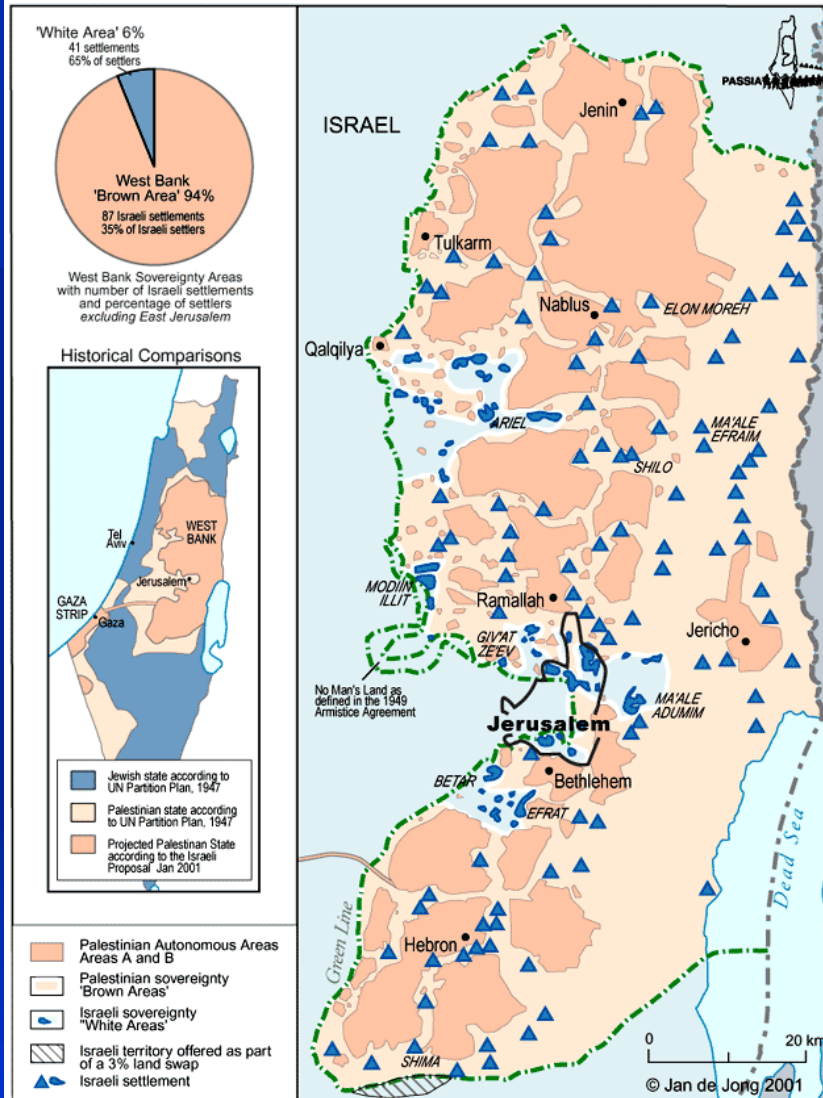

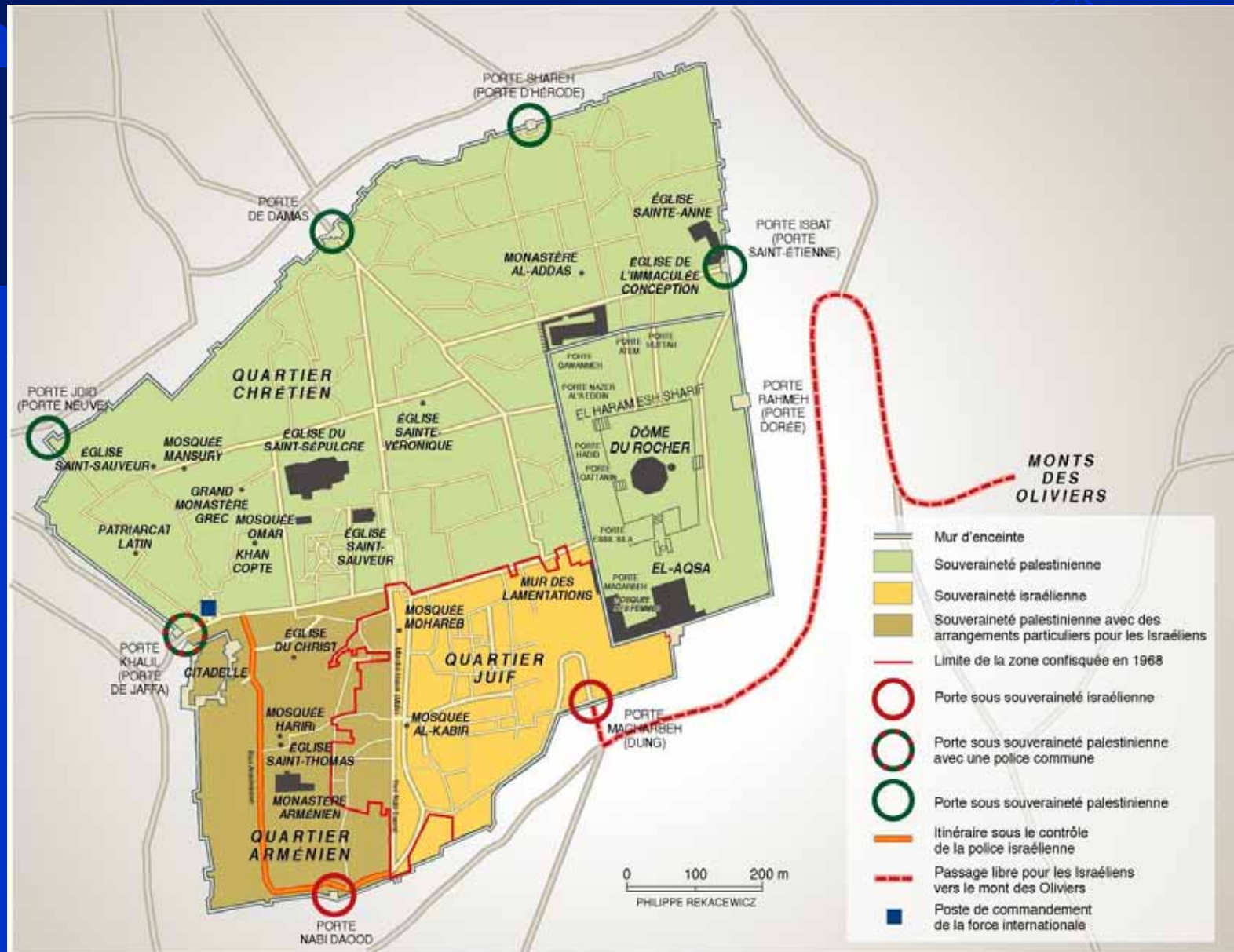

Based on a 6% West Bank Territorial Transfer to Israel

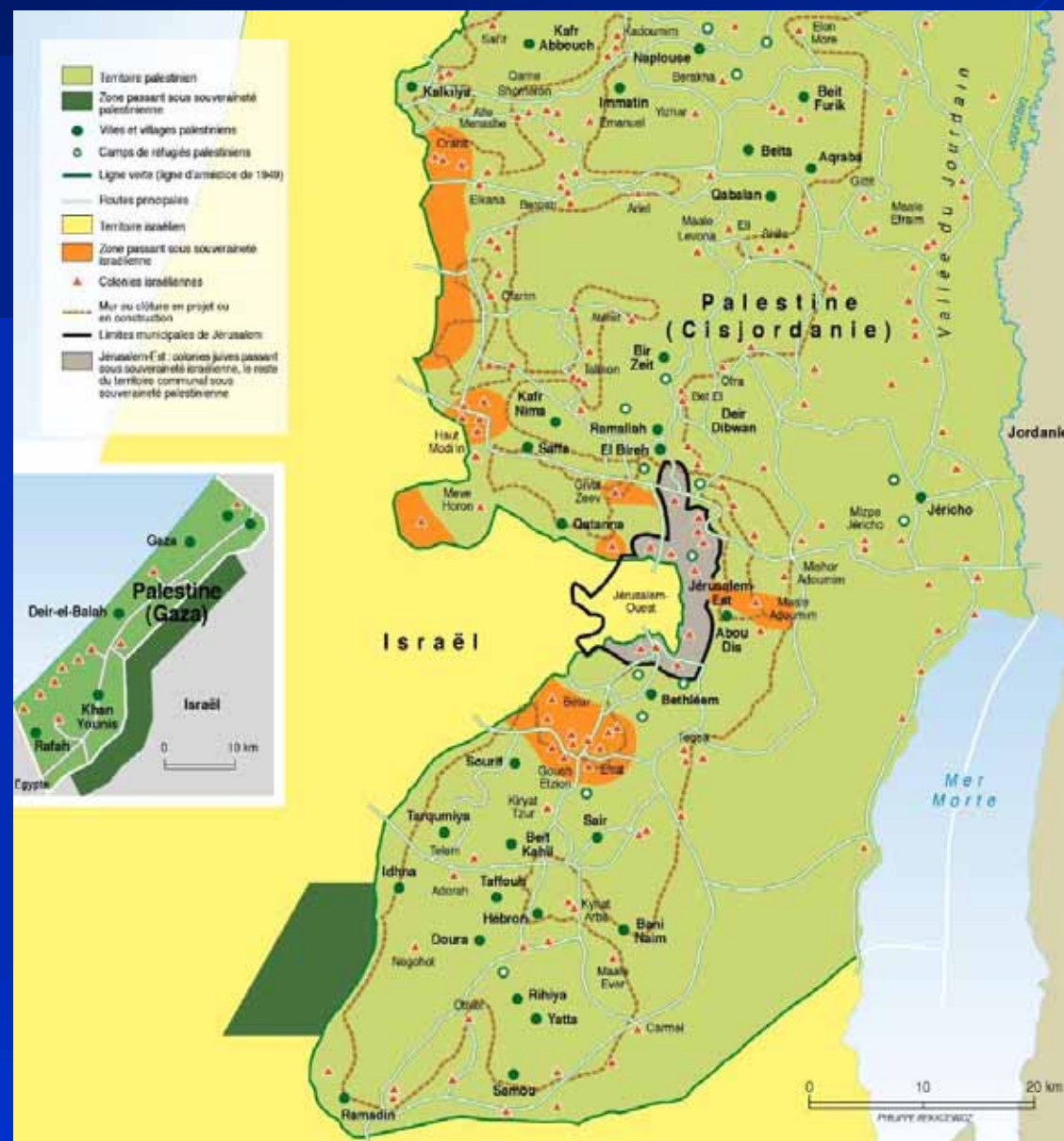

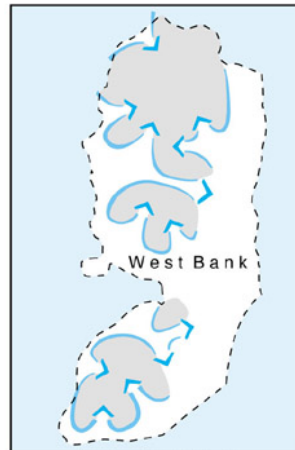

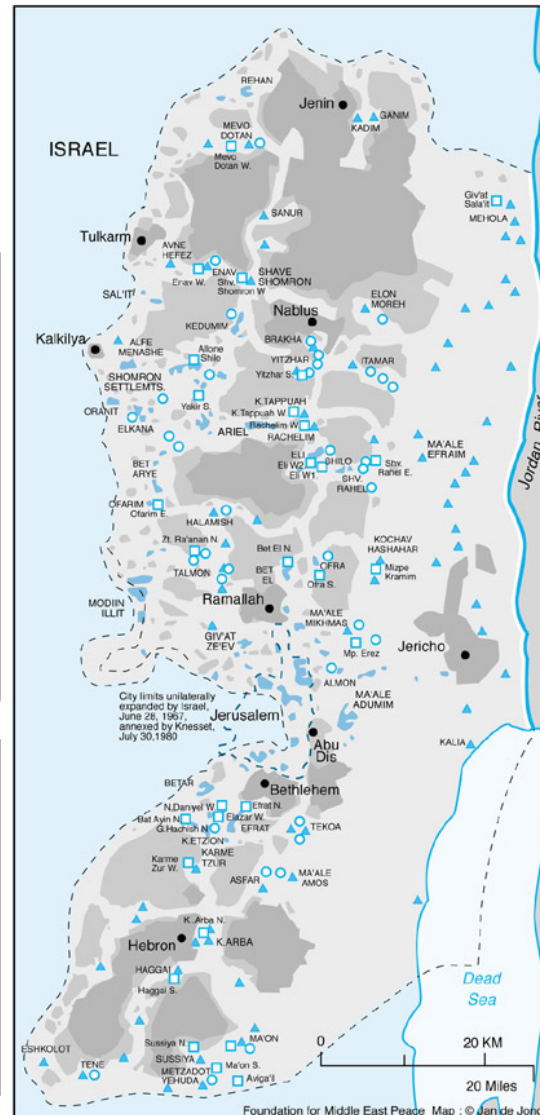

Direction of Territorial Control Exercised by Settlement Outposts

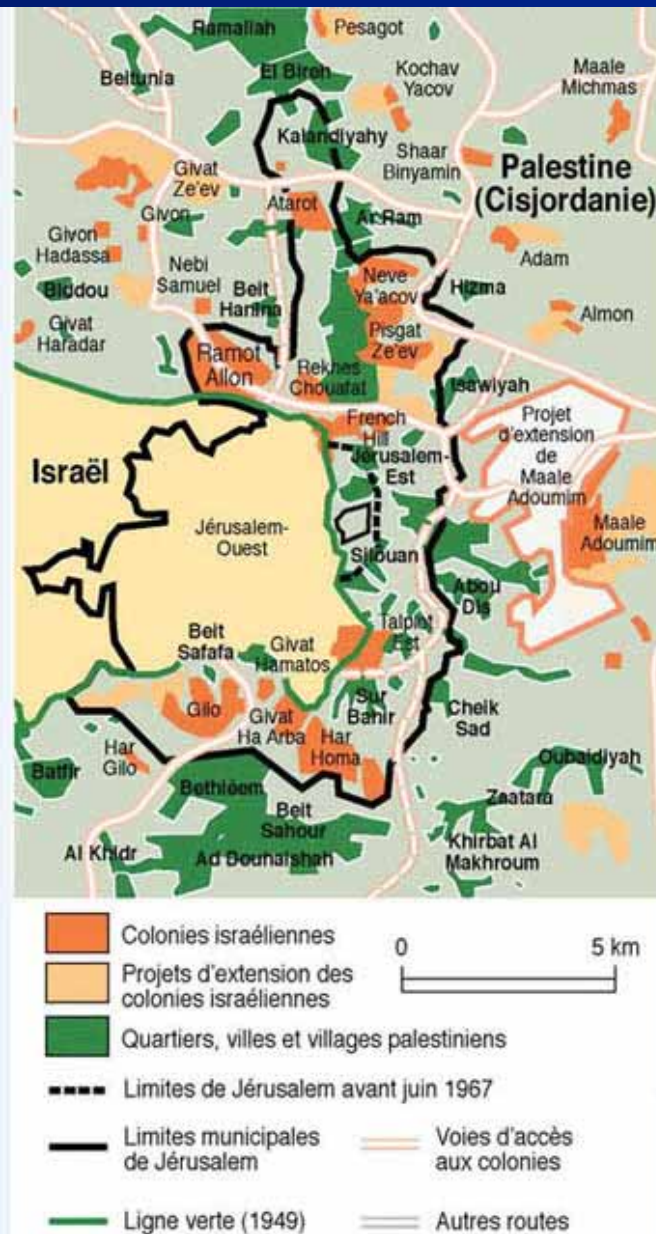

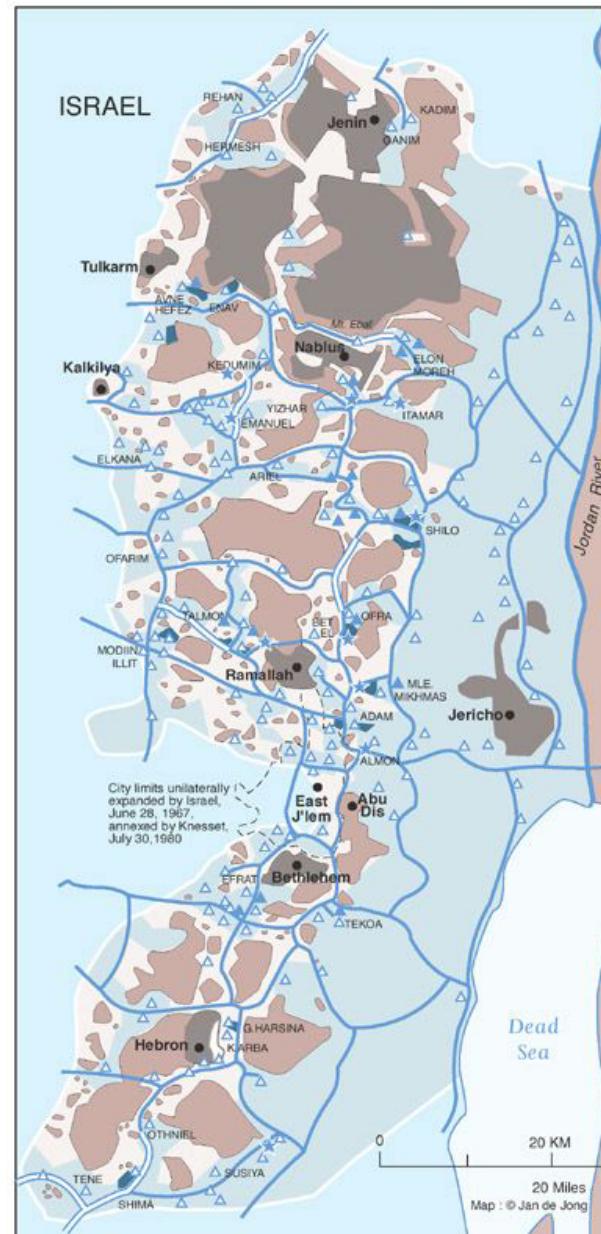

The present map reflects information concerning Israeli settlements which has been submitted to the Special Committee to Investigate Israeli Practices Affecting the Human Rights of the Palestinian People and Other Arabs of the Occupied Territories.

The designations employed and the presentation of material on this map do not imply the expression of any opinion whatsoever on the part of the Special Committee or the Secretariat of the United Nations concerning the legal status of any country, territory, city or area or of its authorities, or concerning the delimitation of its frontiers or boundaries.

A number of settlements in the Occupied Territories were reported to have been expanded since the 28th report of the Special Committee (AN/HSS/7). For ease of reference, these settlements have been marked in red color. Among the settlements in the West Bank which were established but not located, Oranit was said to have been expanded. Among the settlements in the Gaza Strip which were established but not located, Gush Katif and Nissim are reportedly being expanded.

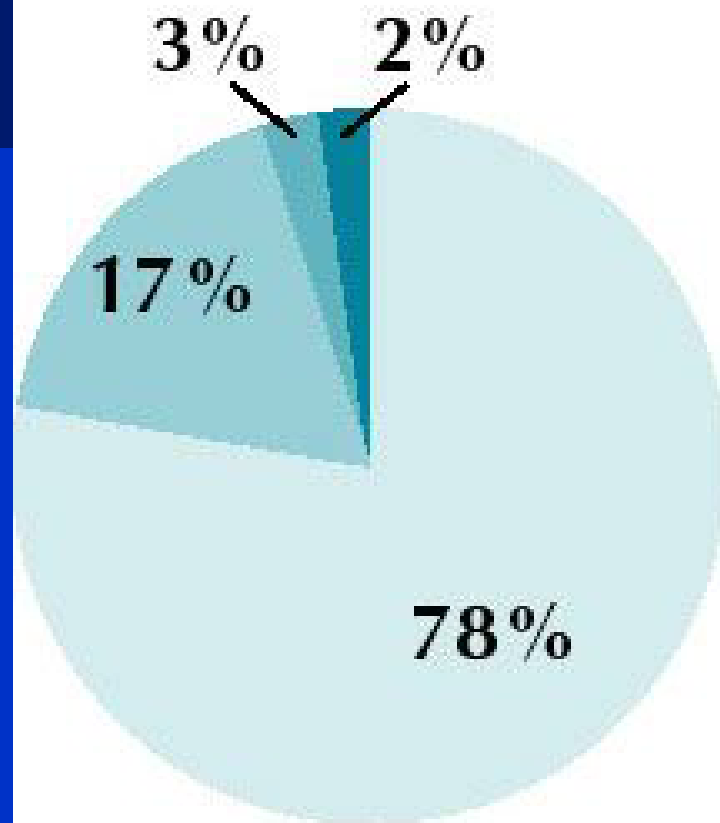

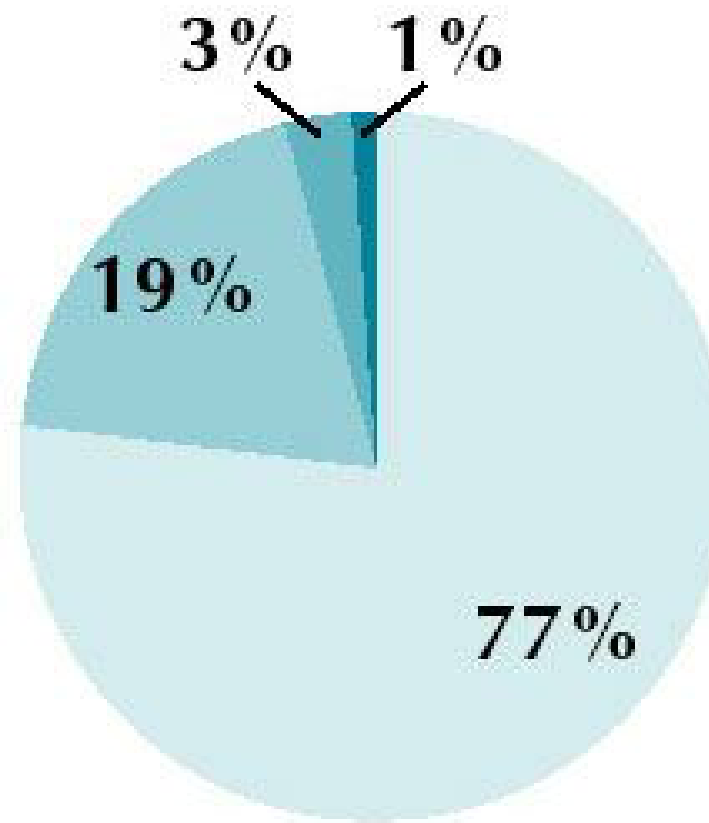

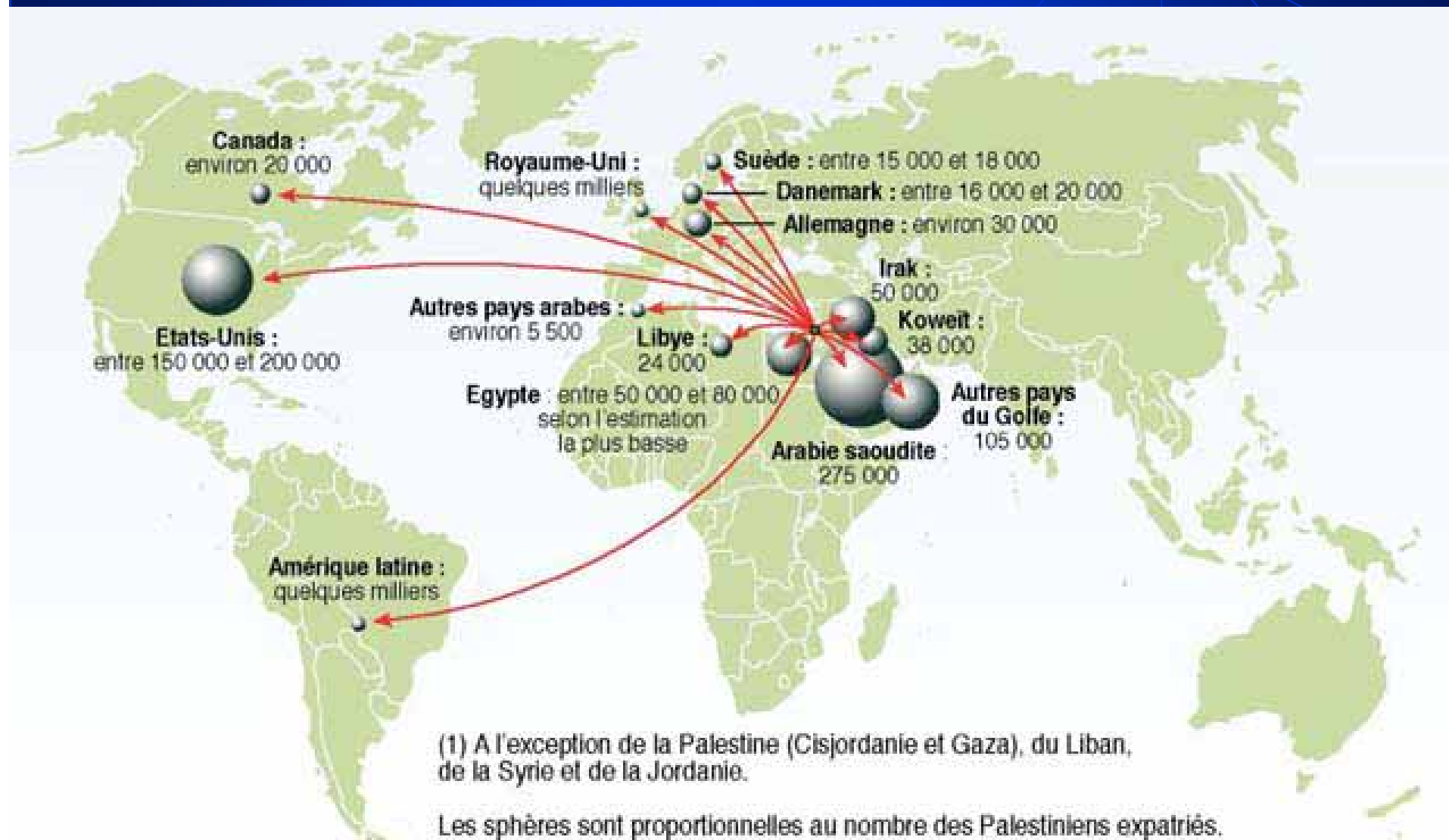

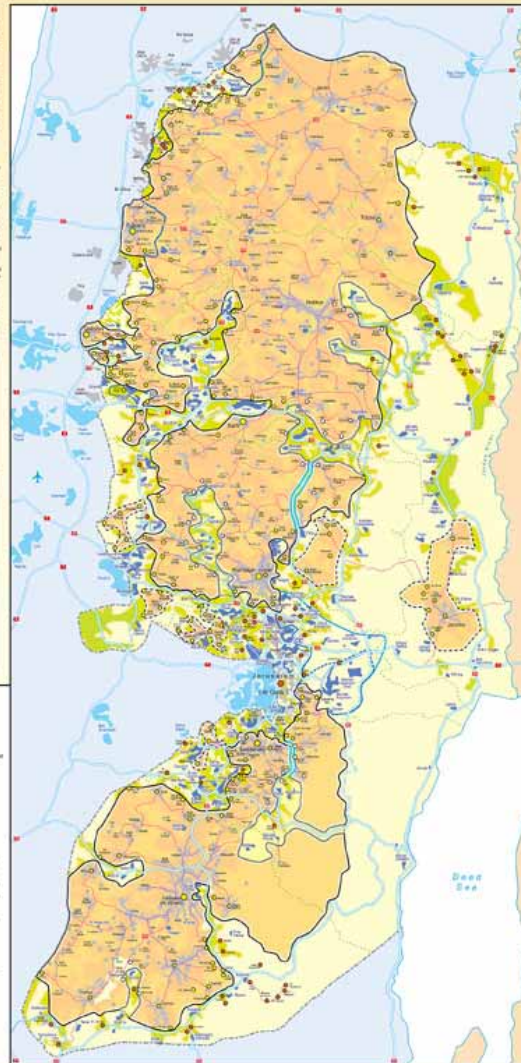

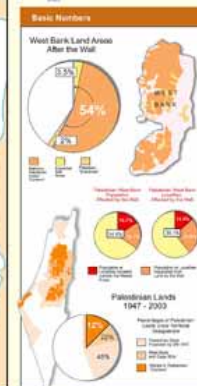
Over 200 communities are directly affected by the Wall, either by being isolated outside of the project's corridor or by being separated from their lands by the Wall. Close to one-half of the West Bank is walled-in, the other half in areas expected to be in the deeply-controlled "Israeli-part" of the West Bank; in these areas settlement expansion and creation are expected to dramatically increase in the process of Israel's *de facto* control of these areas.

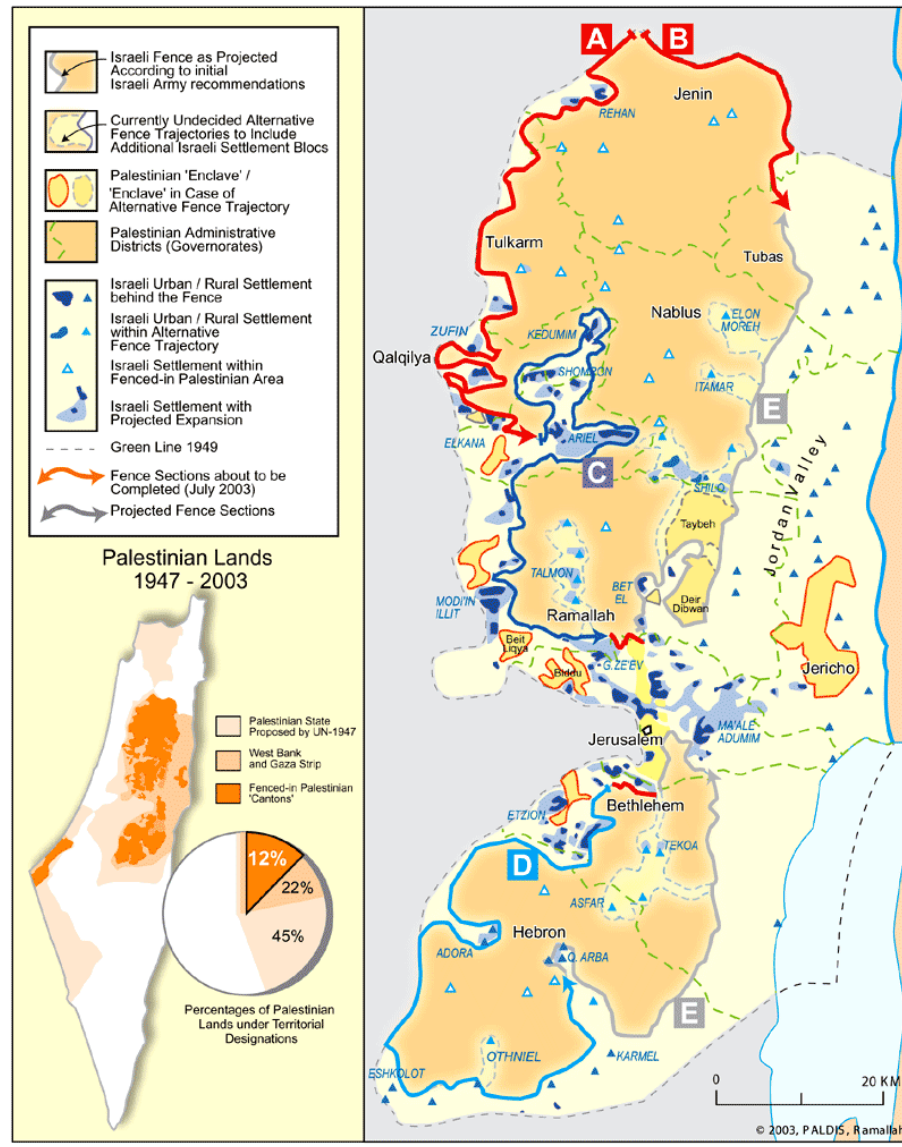

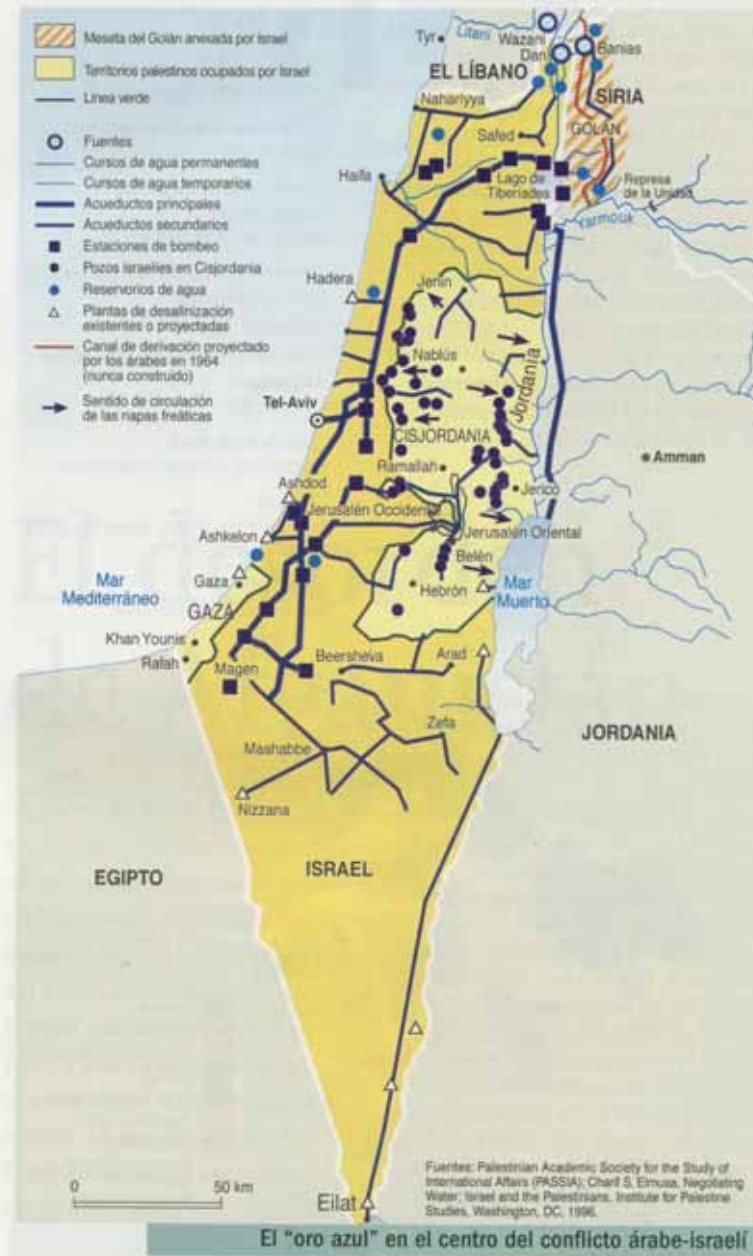

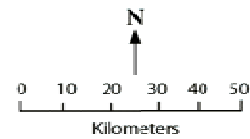

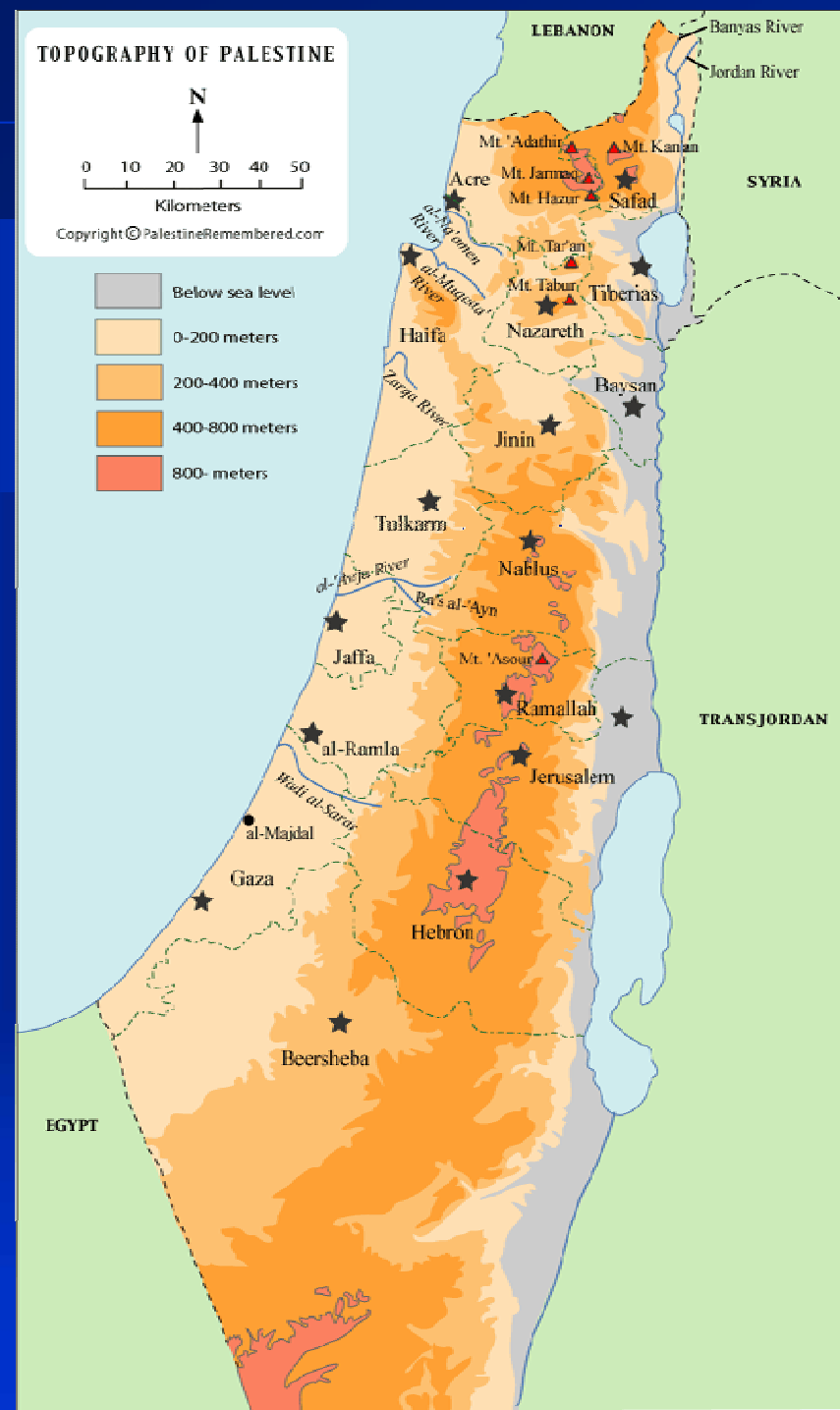

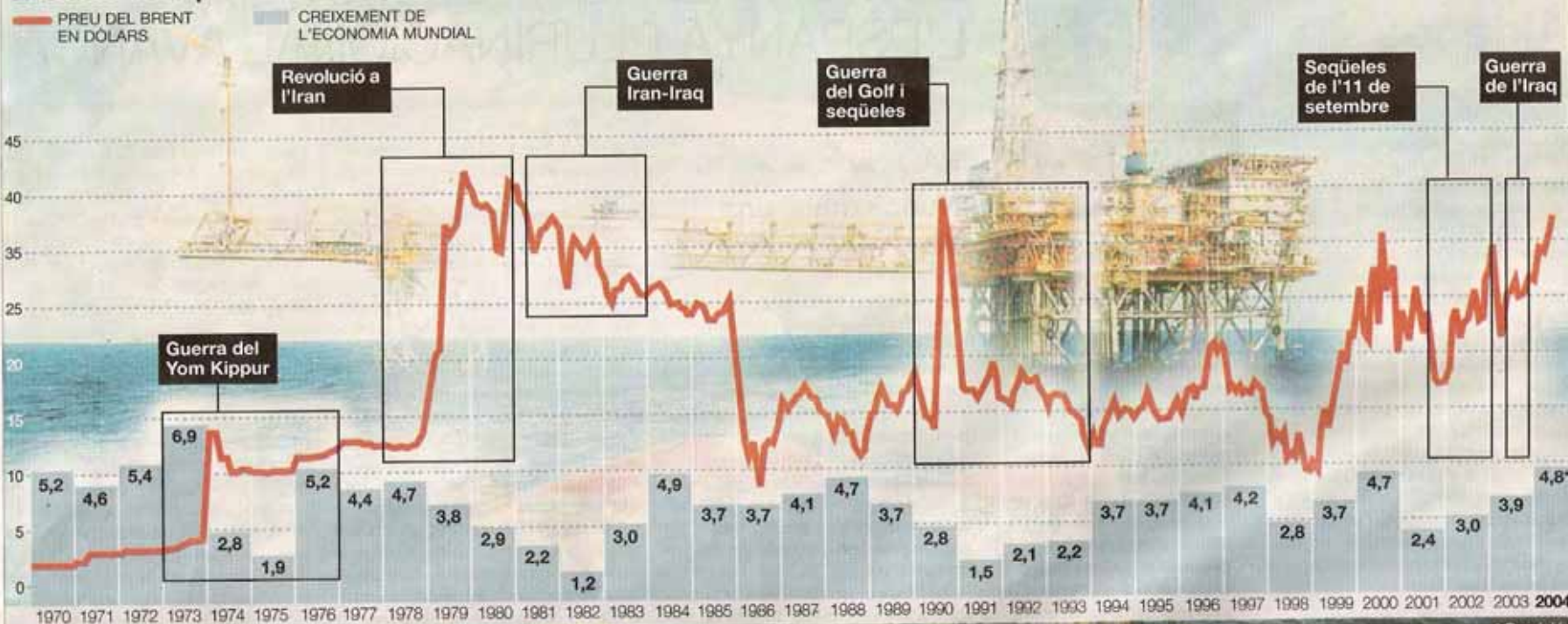

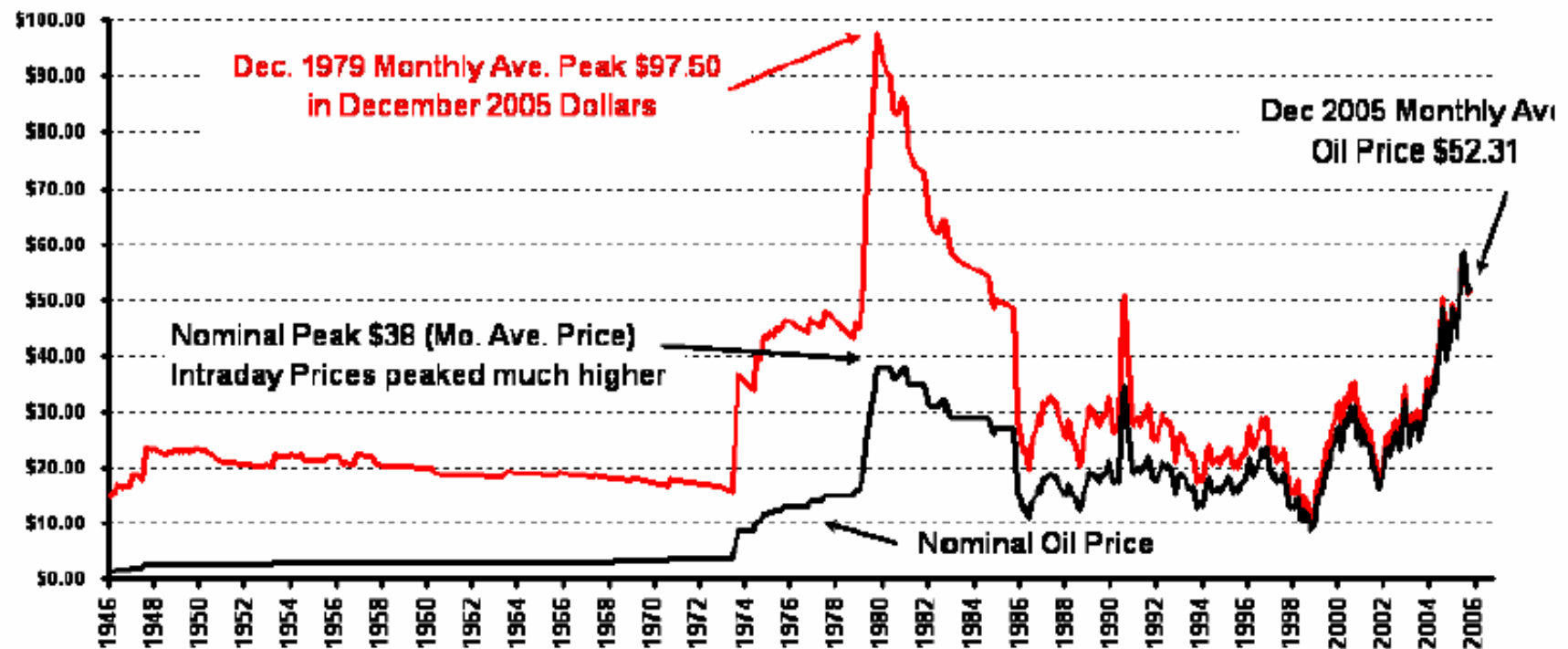
